## **Ride Waiver and Release**

## Read Carefully before signing waives important legal rights

As consideration for participating in the Gallop on the Greenway rides, I agree to abide by the rules of AERC, SEDRA, SERA and the ride. I understand that distance riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, Transportation and Medical facilities. These areas have many natural and man-made hazards, which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control, and unpredictable and that accidents can happen at any time. I agree to take full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding or helping with. This release is also valid for my animals, personal belongings, family members and any guest or crew accompanying me. Under Florida Law, an equine sponsor or professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities (FL Statute 773.01-773.06)

I shall hold the management and participants blameless and free from liability for any accidents, injury or loss that may occur due to my participation in the rides. I shall not pursue legal action against ride management, The Florida Horse Park, the Cross Florida Greenway State park, AERC, SEDRA, SERA.

I agree to have read the covid plan for Gallop o the Greenway and to follow it and all state and local covid safety rules. I will wear a face covering or mask when not on a horse or in my camping area expect when eating at a ride meal. I will follow social distancing to best of my ability. I understand that not following these rules will result my ejection from the competition without refund.

#### **COVID 19 PLAN FOR Gallop on the Greenway Endurance ride**

<u>TRAVEL INTO FL</u> – there are no travel restrictions for traveling into Florida at the present time . Rider may camp the night before but encouraged to come the morning of ride.

<u>REGISTRATION</u> – Registration should be done in advance by snail or email (with payment and waivers brought with you to ride) received 3 days (weekends count) before the ride. THIS INCLUDES A MODIFIED WAIVER TO INCLUDE COMMUNICABLE DISEASES with emergency contact information. <u>EVERY PERSON IN YOUR VEHICLE OR COMING WITH YOU TO INCLUDE VOLUNTEERS, OWNERS, CREW MUST SIGN A WAIVER</u>. In cases with justifiable reasons, late registrations may be considered by RM. There will be a registration office open on site for a few hours each evening. If you plan to register late, you must arrive with a hard copy of entry form, waivers for all people, coggins and payment before you unload! Ride is not limited to any number of riders to limit total number to less than 250 people.

<u>SIGNS</u> – will be posted at the entrance telling people to remain in their vehicles until cleared to unload after they receive their packets. CDC recommendations about the symptoms of Covid 19 and how to prevent its spread will be posted along with camp rules (e.g. no chewing gum, masks/face coverings in camp that you must provide).

#### **ARRIVAL** – When people arrive:

- 1. Human temperatures will be checked and no one with a temperature of 99.9 or higher will be allowed to unload at the venue.
- 2. Each person in the vehicle must confirm they have not had a positive COVID 19 test or been exposed to a person with COVID 19 in the last 14 days.
- 3. Anyone with COVID symptoms cannot attend the event.
- 4. Ride cards will be kept at the vet check filed by distance/rider number. The rider may view their ride card before they leave the vet check each time. For AERC riders, they should leave a stamped self-addressed envelope and their ride card will be mailed to them or get them the day after ride
- 5. The trail directions and vet talk will be provided by hard copy upon arrival. Maps/colors of the trail loops will be posted near the timer tent and people must social distance and take photos of the trails if they wish. I am trying to make a video to post on line, too.

**CAMPING**, camp gates open at 6 am and will close at sunset. Camp sites will be marked with little orange and red flags and will be 30 ft apart. Horse pens and trailers can be no closer than 10 ft to the next rig.

SANITIZERS - will be available in multiple locations including arrival into the vet check, crew areas and port a pottys.

<u>FACE COVERINGS/MASKS</u> – must be worn in camp unless you are mounted on a horse, unless you are at your trailer. Masks are provided to all volunteers and officials but riders/crew must bring their own. Anyone not wearing a masked when not mounted and with 6ft of another person will be asked to leave without a refund.

RIDE MEETING will be done with a louder speaker and ride should be very social distanced(8-10 feet) MEALS provided will handed out in order of ride number. written information provided upon arrival.

TRAILS – Social distancing should be practiced on horseback. Riders should only pass someone when you have plenty of room to safely pass with 10 feet of space between you and other riders. Failure to comply may result in disqualification from the ride.

<u>VET CHECKS/CREWING</u> – Flakes of hay will be spaced 10 feet apart going into the pulse box and vet check. Only one person per horse may come into the vet check. You should practice social distancing in the vet check and in the crew areas. Crew locations must be spread out to be 10 feet between anyone not in your group.

<u>AWARDS</u> – Prize giving ceremony will be held each evening but social distancing and masks. You may pick up your top ten award between designated times using social distancing techniques wearing face coverings.
